"GETTING TO KNOW THE FOUR EVANGELISTS"



St. John is one of the 12 Apostles chosen by Jesus, is traditionally considered the author of the Fourth Gospel, of the Book of Revelation, and of three Letters, or Epistles, bearing his name. The son of Zebedee and

Salome, John was born in Galilee, probably between A.D. 10&15. His brother James also followed Jesus. Considerable doubt, particularly by modern scholars, has been thrown on the identity of John as the author of the Fourth Gospel. Some claim that John, the son of Zebedee, is not the same as the author of the Gospel, the Book of Revelation, and the three Letters. It is certain that the Fourth Gospel was written a considerable time later than the other three Gospels between A.D. 85 and 95. The Gospel speak of the "disciple whom Jesus loved" it was long assumed that this was John, but the Gospel never identifies this disciple by name. Doubt has also been created by some scholars who have concluded that the three Letters were not written by the author of the Fourth Gospel. Tradition relates that John was banished to the Greek island of Patmos during the persecution of Roman emperor Domitian where he wrote the Book of Revelation. Tradition from the 2nd century claimed that John died and was buried at Ephesus. The **EAGLE** symbolizes John because they are considered wise and clairvoyant, which when it flies it looks straight at the sun, and the gospel of John is more abstract and theological than the others. St. John, Pray for us.

Holy Week is the most important week in the Church's year. It's a time when we closely meditate the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. We remember his actions, reflect on his messages, and recommit to living as his disciples in the world today. Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday, which marks Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. Palm branches used on Palm Sunday symbolize peace and triumph. Sacred Triduum are the three days before Easter. The three days consist of Holy Thursday – on which Christ's Last Supper is commemorated; Good Friday – on which the Crucifixion and Death of Christ are highlighted and during which the faithful fast; and Holy Saturday, which is marked by its silence during which we are invited to contemplate Christ in the tomb. The Holy Triduum ends, "concluding with Vespers on Easter Sunday..." As we enter into the holiest week of the year, it is essential that each of us see the journey of Christ this week as our own calling in life. We must journey toward the glory of the Cross with our Lord. From a worldly perspective, the Cross does not make sense. But from the perspective of the Father in Heaven, the Cross is not only the source of the greatest glory of His Son, but it is also the path by which we share in that glory. We must die with Him, sacrifice all for Him, choose to follow Him wholeheartedly, and hold nothing back in our resolve to be victorious with Christ's Resurrection.
