

A WORD FROM THE PASTOR...

I think most of the priests at least once might have faced this question "What made you to choose priesthood?" Well... In my case, I have been asked by many this question and I must have given many generic answers along the way. But now, as I reflect more on this question, though I had the desire to become a priest, I didn't choose but it's our Lord who chose me or any to the priesthood however unworthy I might be or others are. "It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit" (Jn15:16). So we don't choose but we are all chosen. In the Old Testament, it's very evident that all who were called to shepherd and lead the people of Israel were chosen by God. A WORD FROM THE PASTOR...

I believe the day we receive Holy Communion is as important as our Birthdays. How precious was that day and I wonder how often we remember that day and celebrate it like the birthdays? Mine was on 4/22/1995. What's yours? I still remember that day where I was dressed in white shirt and black pants, walking down the aisle with others in a procession to my assigned seat. Back then we all had to receive the Holy Communion on our tongue as the priest gave us Jesus through intinction. For me, that day was also a kind of a license to be an altar boy as it was mandatory for anyone who served at the Mass. I always took a great pleasure to be an altar boy and had the privilege to observe all the symbolic actions the priests did during the Eucharist. As I was raised in Syro-Malabar Rite, altar boys were kind of a must for the Mass. My home was three miles away from the Church and I never had the luxury of any motor vehicles growing up, that I had to walk to church and back every time. Honestly, I never minded that because I just loved doing that every morning, getting up like at 5:00 and start walking like 5:30 as Mass was at 6:45. Doing that for like six years must have created in me that great desire to be a priest someday.



A WORD FROM THE PASTOR...

From my few words in last weekend's bulletin, you might have noticed that I was raised in Syro-Malabar Rite which makes me a Bi-ritual priest. To give you a little background about our Roman Catholic Church, the majority of all Catholics follow the Roman Rite, but there are also a few other Eastern Rite Catholic Churches that are in communion with Rome, like mine. Though a major part of the whole country in India follow Hinduism, other religions have its root as well. Christianity back in my state goes all the way back to St. Thomas the Apostle, who landed on the shores of our state (Kerala) in AD 52. Even though the tradition says that there were Christians even before his arrival, the root of our Rite began with his evangelization and hence we are called "St. Thomas Christians" even to the present time. He was martyred in 72 AD in my neighboring state (Tamil Nadu) and was laid to rest by his disciples in Mylapore, the church built by himself. Currently, there are close to 5 million Catholics who are part of my Rite. There is one diocese for all those Catholics in this Rite scattered across our Nation (Diocese of Chicago). There are four canonized saints from this Rite (St. Alphonsa, St. Euphresia, St. Mariam Thresia & St. Chavara). On this feast of the Assumption, may our Blessed Mother be our constant companion in our journey of faith.
