

UPDATE ON CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

Although COVID presented many challenges to construction projects within our church community we have been very fortunate to complete several and are near completion on others.

St. Philip Neri Church has been completely reroofed with funds provided through the generosity of the Capital Campaign. This project was completed at a cost of \$21,500. Again at St. Philip Neri, we are faced with a boiler replacement as the existing boiler has aged out and a temporary repair was able to get us through last winter. Various contractors are being approached for pricing on a new unit plus installation. We are waiting to hear back from the Diocese but we believe funding for this project can come from a balance left in the Capital Campaign as we have completed projects slated for that. Will keep you posted as bids come in for this new heating system. A new sink and vanity has been installed in the parish hall for the parish as well and it has been refreshing to see this hall coming back into use.

St. Elizabeth's Church has been completely reroofed with an upgrade to metal roofing. Structurally this roof is sound but with many years of age we found it necessary to keep snow load completely off. This project was totally funded through a savings balance with the final cost at \$18,000. The rectory has also received a much needed facelift. Several of the very old carpets were removed and hardwood floors refinished in the living room, main office and master bedroom. The chapel is in the process of receiving new flooring, painted walls and a new ceiling as old panels literally were beginning to drop down. The main office walls will also receive fresh paint and a new ceiling. The master bathroom will be getting a new shower unit and sink due to the age of existing fixtures. These projects are all funded in entirety through a savings balance and will be completed at an estimated cost of somewhere between \$15,000 to \$17,000.

St. Philip of Jesus Church is still in the process of getting the elevator. Having met with AEDA for several hours recently, a new design is being drawn and costs estimated. Having taken into account structural aspects and the many challenges in getting an upgrade to accommodate caskets for funerals, it is thought we may be able to keep the entire unit inside the preexisting stairwell. At first thought and glance this did not seem feasible but with many careful measurements and movement of hall entry to the other side it may be doable. This change could create a very unique entryway and still maintain the historical aspect of the church. Another beneficial aspect is that costs for the elevator would be reduced significantly allowing us funds to redo the outside entry. I should have more information on this project in the very near future.

In a nutshell, this is a brief overview of where we are with our church buildings. We realize that many funds have been spent but without completion of these projects, especially the roofs, the costs would become increasingly higher if left much longer. We would like to also offer a very sincere "Thank You" for your generous contributions and especially your kind patience. May God bless us in keeping us "dry and warm"! Thanks again, Deacon Paul
