Pentecost stands for Power and Life. At today's frenzied pace of life, harmony seems swept aside. Pulled in a thousand directions, we run the risk of nervous exhaustion and so

we react badly to everything. Then we look for the quick fix, popping one pill after another to keep going, one thrill after another to feel alive. But more than anything else, we need the Holy Spirit: he brings order to our frenzy. The Spirit is peace in the midst of restlessness, confidence in the midst of discouragement, joy in sadness, youth in aging, courage in the hour of trial. Amid the stormy currents of life, he lowers the anchor of hope. As Saint Paul writes, the Spirit keeps us from falling back into fear, for he makes us realize that we are beloved children (Rom 8:15). WHY DO WE NEED TO OBSERVE "<u>SACRED SILENCE</u>" BEFORE MASS?

Some Catholic parishes are accustomed to visiting and socializing in the pews before Eucharist starts. Many may see this as a great opportunity to build community and friendships. On the other hand, however, those few minutes before Mass are very precious moments. Think about it for a minute: For most of us, our weeks are filled with an incredible amount of commotion, noise, and conversationwhich is just a fact of life. But I know that so many of us long for some peace and quiet throughout our week. For some individuals, the best time to have a period of silence and quiet is at the beginning of Mass as a time of preparation and prayer. Yes, fellowship is important. Yes, catching up with our friends is a valued part of any human relationship. But, when we come to Mass and enter into the church, our primary concern is to enter into dialogue and communion with Christ. As Catholics, this relationship reaches its pinnacle in our reception of the Eucharist. Some may think that the practice of maintaining a spirit of silence before Mass is "stuffy" or unwelcoming. Allowing time for silent prayer, however, is a clear indication that we primarily come to Mass to both hear God's voice and for Him to hear us. At the same time, a vibrant parish is also one in which fellowship and community is encouraged. This can be done in a variety of ways: from social gatherings in the parish hall or even simply catching up with friends and family AFTER Mass. We should in no way feel embarrassed or rude in desiring and expecting a spirit of silence before the celebration of Mass. The Lord is constantly laboring to love us and to speak to us. In order for Him to enter more fully into our lives, both time and space are needed. He indeed gives us that time and space before Mass—our job is to take full advantage of that tremendous gift that He gives to us Sunday after Sunday. Thank you for your attention.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK...

Happy Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, our Lord and God! What a Gift we celebrate today! The Eucharist is everything. It's all things, the fullness of life, eternal salvation, mercy, grace, happiness, etc. Why is the Eucharist all this and so much more? Simply put, Eucharist IS God. Period. Therefore, the Eucharist is all that God is. In his beautiful traditional hvmn, "Adoro te Devote," St. Thomas Aquinas writes, "I devoutly adore You, O hidden Deity, truly hidden beneath these appearances. My whole heart submits to You, and in contemplating You, it surrenders itself completely. Sight, touch, taste is all deceived in their judgment of You, but hearing suffices firmly to believe ... " What a glorious statement of faith in this wondrous gift. This statement of faith reveals that when we worship before the Eucharist, we worship God Himself hidden under the appearance of bread and wine. As we celebrate this solemn feast, may I remind you that whenever we walk into the sacred space of our churches we are in the Divine Presence and expected to show our reverence by our proper disposition. Though we may have the temptation to socialize and talk loudly in the Church before Mass, we need to overcome that. We do that when we know truly, what and whom we are receiving in the Most Holy Eucharist. I pray that we all will have that sacred awareness of God's presence especially in the tabernacle and maintain sacred silence in our churches.

THOUGHTS ON EVANGELIZATION Readings: Gn 14:18-20/1 Cor 11:23-26/Lk 9:11b-17

In our gospel of the feeding of the five thousand, there is an allusion to the Eucharist: Jesus looked up to heaven, said the blessing, broke the bread and fish, and gave them to the disciples ... Today these are still the action of the priest as he confects the Eucharist. The line that struck me in today's Gospel is that *they all ate and were satisfied*. The hungry will be filled. What are we hungering for? Do we desire to receive Jesus? The Lord longs to fill us, to fulfill our desire for him. Let us open our heart today and not be afraid to ask him to come to us and transform our lives.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK...



St. Peter and St. Paul (Feast: June 29th): Two men called by God to do great things. Two men who certainly were not born equipped to serve the Lord, but rather, two men who were equipped by the Lord himself with the grace necessary to preach the Gospel and ultimately to give up their lives

for His sake. First came Peter: a young fisherman living on the coast of the Sea of Galilee in a marginal province of the mighty Roman Empire. A man prone to outbursts and weak under pressure. Then came Paul: an intellectual, learned Pharisee who persecuted Christians, even ordering the stoning of the first martyr of the Church, Saint Stephen. Our apostles were a denier of Christ and a murderer of Christians. An encounter with Jesus' mercy equipped them with the necessary grace to even die for their Savior. This fact fills us with much Hope and Joy. We can all ask a simple question: If a denier and a murderer can be transformed by the mercy of Jesus Christ, why can't I? If Jesus called two unlikely characters to be the great apostles of the Roman Church, why can't Jesus be calling me to do great things? To do great things in my family, at my workplace, at my parish, in my community, my country, my Church. Jesus doesn't call the ready to follow him, he rather readies the called. May he grant us the grace we need so that our lives can be constantly renewed and transformed with the great hope we find in Peter and Paul, two unlikely men called by God to do great things.

THOUGHTS ON EVANGELIZATION Readings: 1 Kgs 19:16b, 19-21/Gal 5:1, 13-18/Lk 9:51-62

St. Paul tells us today that for freedom Christ set us free. But freedom does not mean to do whatever we want or even what is expected by our culture. Freedom is freedom to do the right thing. This is often hard and countercultural. In today's gospel, the three would-be-followers of Jesus each have a good reason to delay the call to follow. The choice to follow Jesus is rarely the easy path. Yet, we are asked to follow none-the-less. Pray today to hear God's call to you so you can answer with the words of the Alleluia verse: Speak Lord, your servant is listening; you have the words of everlasting life. And then, as our mother Mary taught us, do whatever he tells you.
