PLENARY INDULGENCE: This year, the Vatican has decided once again to grant a plenary indulgence to Catholics who visit a cemetery to pray for the dead and reciting an Our Father and the Creed, done on any day in November. A plenary indulgence remits all temporal punishment due to sin. It must always be accompanied by a full detachment from sin. A Catholic who wishes to obtain a plenary indulgence must also fulfill the ordinary conditions of an indulgence, which are sacramental confession, reception of the Eucharist, and prayer for the pope's intentions. Sacramental confession and reception of the Eucharist can occur up to about 20 days before or after the indulgenced

Now, how to set up an appointment with Bishop? Not me. Like Jeremiah, I must have thought, I was too young to make the phone call. So, whom should I go... to my parents or the pastor? I was confused!

"Confusion" can make us feel powerless, anxious, stressed and a whole host of other draining emotions. Is it bad? But what if I told you that confusion can be good at times? Yes, while confusion can stir up a seamlessly never-ending cloud of fog that envelops everything around us, it is also a sign of great and powerful change. Think about it. If everything made sense to us all the time, how would we ever grow? If we were always hundred percent certain about every decision we made or every fork in the road, how would we ever shift or evolve? When we feel confused, it's a sign that our mind is expanding a little more. It's a sign that we are allowing our hearts, minds, body, and soul to make room for something that wasn't there before. 

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK...

"Advent" marks the beginning of a new Liturgical year. The Advent season is a time of preparation that directs our hearts and minds to Christ's second coming at the end of time and to the anniversary of Our Lord's birth on Christmas. From the earliest days of the Church, people have been fascinated by Jesus' promise to come back. But the scripture readings during Advent tell us not to waste our time with predictions. Advent is not about speculation rather it calls us to be alert and ready, not weighted down and distracted by the cares of this world. Now, the Advent wreath is one among the many attractions of this season. The use of the wreath and candles during Advent are a longstanding Catholic tradition that was originally adopted by Christians in the Middle Ages as part of their spiritual preparation for Christmas. The wreath and candles are full of symbolism tied to the Christmas season. The wreath itself, which is made of various evergreens, signifies continuous life. The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning or end, symbolizes the eternity of God, the immortality of the soul, and the everlasting life we find in Christ. Advent also includes an element of penance in the sense of preparing, quieting, and disciplining our hearts for the full joy of Christmas.

EACH CANDLE ON THE ADVENT WREATH HAS ITS SIGNIFICANCE

The first lit purple candle symbolizes **HOPE.** It is sometimes called the "prophecy candle" in remembrance of the prophets, especially Isaiah, who foretold the birth of Christ. It represents expectation felt in anticipation of the coming Messiah.
