Description: The Diocese of Ogdensburg Diocesan Youth Council (DYC) is a group comprised of members in grades 10-12 who live in the Diocese of Ogdensburg. Each member serves on DYC for a one-year term (members are able to re-apply annually to serve for up to three total terms).

The purpose of Diocesan Youth Council is twofold: 1. Members will grow in spiritual development and leadership skills so they may take a more active role in their local parishes, particularly in youth ministry efforts on the local level. 2. Members will help plan & facilitate diocesan-sponsored events (youth rally, Lenten retreat days) and help promote diocesan-sponsored events (youth rallies, Camp Guggenheim, March for Life, regional events, Catholic Heart Work Camp, etc.). Diocesan Youth Council is an opportunity to grow in leadership, build friendships, and have fun. It is also a significant responsibility, requiring maturity and commitment. Applying to DYC should be taken seriously and with prayerful consideration.

Requirements:

- 1. Members must be in grades 10-12.
- 2. Members must demonstrate active involvement in the Church at the parish level.
- 3. Members must demonstrate leadership skills, integrity, motivation, and a love for the Lord. Members must attend:
- ...One Lenten Retreat Day ...Youth Rally
- ...Annual retreat day or weekend experience
- ... A minimum of 6 council meetings virtually or in-person. Schedules and locations to be determined by the Director of Youth Ministry and DYC members.



Guess... it's time to come back to my journal. Grown up in a Syro-Malabar Rite had a great influence in my devotion to the Holy Eucharist and then to the priesthood. Before joining the Seminary in the year 2000, I used to attend the Summer Vocation Camps hosted by my native Diocese of Palai, Kerala in their Minor Seminary which was only like 10 miles away from my Home. The camp was like for a week, where lots of young people came together from across our Diocese to discern their call to the priesthood. We had the celebration of the Eucharist, Sessions on Priesthood, Games and of course good food. It was a time of fun and at the same time getting to know many priests from the Diocese. It was my desire then to be a Diocesan priest and stay close to my family and all that, but then the thought came that since there were lots of priests in my diocese back then, I decided to join a Syro-Malabar Diocese in my neighboring state where they had a shortage of priests. So, I boarded a bus with a fellow Seminarian from my neighborhood to see the seminary in May 2000 and had decided to join them. Continuing from the previous weekend... When I got back home having almost decided to join the Diocesan Seminary (Syr0-Malabar Rite) in my neighboring state, I noticed a pamphlet in my living room left by a couple of Missionary Priests who came in my absence wondering if I could join in theirs. In their pamphlet, I noticed that they had mentioned a great deal about shortage of priests around the world and their priests were working in many states in India plus US and other European Countries. I believe that was the moment I started to think about Church as a wider family than just a small group of my native Rite family. Back then, there was plenty of priests and religious nuns across my home diocese and all other southern states in India (NOT so now). Because of this, I had that feeling to go out of my comfort zone at home and explore places, cultures, people and do all I can for their spiritual wellbeing, if God will choose me to be a priest. I do strongly believe that if one is smart and brilliant enough, he or she could achieve any profession they desire in life, but not the priesthood or any other religious vocations. God makes the final call however unworthy that person might be, and I had witnessed it which I will write later... Now, having made a final decision to join this Missionary Society, I had no clue how to present it to my parents.
